#### 1. Team overview

The primary role of the West Regional trials team is to conduct trials and evaluations on a range of agricultural and horticultural crops. The dedication of the team combining with experience and local knowledge to manage a range of crops to enable the team to offer services across a range of environments, soil types and as part of commercial crop rotations. Good team and inter-departmental working are key to our successful operations.

The West Regional team carries out work on over 20,000 plots, covering an area including Herefordshire, Shropshire, Cheshire, Warwickshire, Gloucestershire and Wales.

#### 2. Role purpose

Leading the trials team responsible for the NIAB field trials operations based at or run from the Hereford centre. The role will focus on the delivery of high-quality field trials and demonstration plots across a broad range of crop species including combinable crops, root, herbage and forage crops to evaluate varietal performance, disease resistance and agrochemical efficacy. The team carry out trials for a wide range of commercial and levy board customers as well as trials carried out for the NIAB Network. The role also involves working with other centres across the regions to support the delivery of our national trials programme and helping to manage and share resources when workload requires.

Deliver results according to set protocols and to pre-determined timetables. Ensure that health and safety guidelines are followed.

To deputise for the Regional Manager as required.

#### 3. Financial authority/responsibility

Delegated day-to-day spending is under the control of the post holder who also assists the Regional Manager in the preparation of an annual budget and planning for capital expenditure.

Authority to approve purchase orders within defined limits.

Manage budgets for consumables, equipment repairs, maintenance contracts and temporary staff.

#### 4. Key relationships

**Internal** Reports to Regional Manager.

Responsible for line management, functional management and team leadership of staff at the centre.

Required to build strong working relationship with Regional Agronomist and relevant Crop Specialists and Contract Managers within the business.

**External:** Required to liaise with host growers; especially Monkhall Farm and their staff to ensure

that field operations are carried out in a timely manner and to fit into the host's work

schedules.

Liaison with customers to deliver their trials according to protocol.

### 1. Working conditions

Work is split between office and field, which varies according to the season.

Manual handling – occasional handling items of up to 25kg.

Physically demanding work. Walking, standing, bending and manual handling of items up to 25 kg.

Working outdoors in any weather condition at all times of the year, meaning exposure to sunlight and rain.

Regular exposure to plant material, pathogens, pollen, bees and other insects.

Managed exposure to chemicals e.g. seeds treated with pesticide and fertiliser.

Expected to work additional hours and at weekends as workload and season dictates.

Some periods of lone working both indoors and out.
